 Profuse lavender daisies on 16 inch plants. Bloom early fall. Use on the border or in the rock garden. Sun

 Small white daisies on compact 10 inch plants for the border or in the rock garden. Likes sun. Fall blooming.

 16-20" Dark purple blooms. Orange-purple in winter.

 Large pale purplish-burgundy leaves, lilac-red blooms

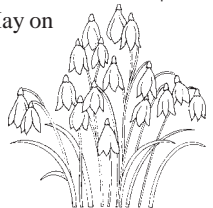

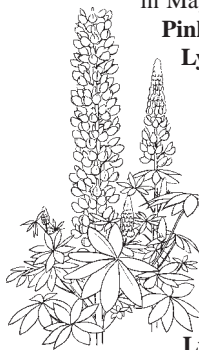
